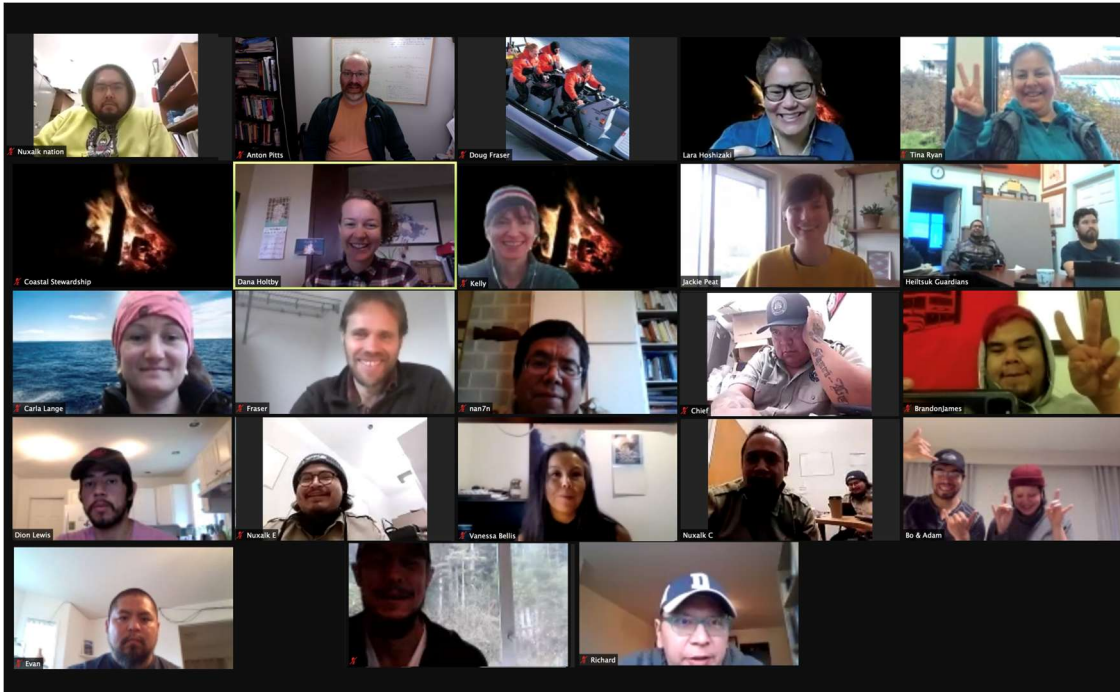




Coastal Stewardship Network Annual Gathering
Gathering Online to Celebrate Stewards
October 29th, 2020 – via zoom



Context:

We had hoped to host CSNAG 2020 in Klemtu, Kitasoo/Xai'Xais territory. However, with the onset of COVID-19 travel to communities was deemed too great a risk and the in-person gathering was postponed. Following a field season marked by delays, interruptions and the disruptions of COVID lockdowns, CSNAG 2020 was held online. The gathering brought together Guardians from six of the CFN member Nations to connect, celebrate, and unwind after a difficult year.

- Celebrate individual and team accomplishments
- Share challenges and success from the field

Summary:

Guardians from 6 of the 7 CFN member Nations met on the morning of Thursday October 29th. While we were unable to meet in person, the CSN team did their best to create an atmosphere of connection and sharing. Prior to the meeting, Training Coordinator Jackie Peat mailed a care-package to each team with gathering swag (CGW branded face masks), a tea light and a smores kit. To open the session Guardians were asked to light their candles and 'sit around the fire' to chat and connect with the other teams.

During the first session, each Nation took a turn introducing their team members and outlining their past season. Many Guardian teams had new members, and most expressed the difficulty of getting out into the field/on the water given the restrictions imposed by COVID-19.



Following a short break, the group was brought back together to watch the newly released CSN video. The video highlighted the Guardians and the importance of their work in advancing the sovereignty and stewardship of the Nations.

The group was then divided into Zoom break out rooms to discuss pre-assigned topics. Most groups discussed more than one topic, highlighting amazing stories from the field, the ways in which their cultural traditions shape their work as Guardians, how their communities have responded to COVID-19, and the ways in which Guardians can stay connected throughout the season (highlighting in particular the newly created CGW Facebook group, and the monthly CGW video calls).

Following the discussion groups, the call turned its attention to highlighting the accomplishments of each Nation. The teams were recognized for the following:

- CHN: Protecting the community during COVID-19 by standing up to the Queen Charlotte Fishing Lodge
- Metlakatla: Supporting the Essential Services crew in supplying the community with essential goods during the COVID-19 outbreak
- Gitga'at: Building a cabin on the Gitga'at traditional seaweed harvesting grounds
- Nuxalk: Members of the Nuxalk team worked at the COVID-19 roadblock, protecting the community during the outbreak
- Kitasoo/Xai'Xais: The team received their level 2 whale disentanglement certification from the Blue World Research Institute
